"Transformation of the Swedish Welfare State"

Course Description: "Sweden is often hailed as a long-standing example of the quintessential "welfare state"; however, in recent years, the Social Democratic Party has lost seats in parliament in favor of parties that support a stronger market-based economy. This positions Swedish policy and society in a transformative space between these two traditional varieties of political economy and social policy, and affords an opportunity for students of public policy to examine the benefits and detriments of both. As Sweden privatizes more previously state-owned and controlled industries, the impact on the citizenry can be clearly assessed. This course will examine several public policies in particular, such as: secondary and higher education, transportation, postal services, immigration, religion, environment, and gender and family policy. However, we will also discuss various other public policies (including healthcare, cellular and data networks, energy, taxation, and food and beverages) throughout the course, which will revolve around a ten-day Faculty Led Program (FLP) in Sweden."
